Reflection on Sunday's Readings

Genesis 15:5-12. 17-18 God made a covenant with Abraham. his faithful servant. Philippians 3:17-4:1 Christ will transfigure these bodies of ours into copies of his glorious body. Luke 9:28-36 As Jesus prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning.

The transfiguration of Jesus is a reminder of the transformation of attitude and action required of us to deepen our relationship with God.

God's covenant with Abraham requires trust in God's transforming love. We are called to exert this transforming love, be Christ to those who suffer extreme poverty, injustice and violence, by renewing our covenant to pray, fast and give generously to the work of Project Compassion.

Jesus' identity as the Son of God is confirmed through his transfiguration. This is important in the course of what he is to face through his divine outpouring of self. We are asked to transform our vision and values and use our generosity however big or small to bring about transformation for those who are oppressed.

This week's Project Compassion story reflects such transformation in a new vision for the future for the Indigenous community of Derby, WA. The Kids Future Club, a project supported by Caritas Australia takes a holistic approach to increasing school attendance and raising academic performance for truanting children. The program provides an opportunity for Aboriginal children and their parents to become familiar with structured education, health and nutrition in a culturally relevant way. As the extended family is the important social unit in the Aboriginal community in supporting the wellbeing of children, the Kids Club invites the whole community to be involved in activities.

The program has given children and families a wonderful sense of hope, a desire to participate in those institutions necessary for human fulfilment, such as work and education.



Wretchedness transfigured

Sometimes in the midst of tragedy and sorrow, such as the terrifying bushfires that rayaged Victoria last year, there are many tales of heroism and simple human care. The media commented on many examples. Of course, some people are unable to assist in a very tangible way when the demand is there. The frail and elderly living out their twilight years, the homeless and the unemployed who have little enough themselves, and yet many of these also gave what they could.

Often the 'rejected of society' are treated as just that. But there is always a light that will rise ever so gently when it is least expected. On the Monday following that unforgettable weekend, two long term prisoners in a minimum security complex arranged a 'whip around' to offer some tangible sign of assistance. In the space of an hour, and from some one hundred inmates, over \$1200 was promised, deduction forms were signed and the challenge was on. Within a few days, the other sections of the prison (medium and maximum security, and the women's section) had responded, and the amount had risen to over \$2750! Not a great amount, we could well say, but most weeks many inmates are hanging out to have enough money in their accounts to purchase tobacco or toothpaste!

It was not smugness; it was just a little smile of pride that we could play our small part in the very great need. It is, at times, so hard to feel good about oneself in a place like this. But there is much more goodness in here than many on the outside might imagine.

When I was eight years old I found out by church below the rooffops accident that I was adopted. It was very upsetting. Until then I was always pretty shy but after that shock I really went into my shell and became very

withdrawn. I started praying at night a lot, not just praying on the surface but from a place deep inside myself. There I discovered a part of me that I did not know existed. It was like an awakening to the real me, my true self, and in that sorrow I found comfort in the knowledge that I wasn't alone. I found a friend deep inside me who understood, and that friend was God. With God I found that I could share my most inner self without fear. Now all these years later I realise that God understood and was protecting me. (Michael)
